

1) P. O. Mother, Pottobacco 10 July 1820

I Received yours date 21 Jan^y
 you wish me to take an old woman
 with me to dispose of, you can
 may send her down, I'll try what
 I can do with her, should I not
 sell her directly, I think I can
 manage her — I have paid
 Mr Manning \$90 on acct of the suit
 and I have a small balance in
 my hands collect^d at present but I expect
 to have to pay Mr Henry Lancasters
 account which I Inform you of some
 time ago, I dont calculate to make
 any further collections until the sales
 of peoples Tobacco that are owing

In your next letter you send me a power
Given by the hire of Ann Pigeon
deceased. I shall go to St Marys
County next month to see Philip Ford
I have wrote to him and he has never
answered my letters

As to the conveyance of
the old woman there is no vessel that
sails from this to Ge^o Town Mr. Ralph
Semmes can get some vessel to land her
at Semmes Bay you can speak to him
I wrote to him about the Collection
he had and request, him to report the
result to you. I am very unwell
with a bad cold and must conclude
with due Res^{ts} I am yr^o H^o serv^t
