at any time, he further states that he has complied in  
every respect concerning his Daughters becoming men, therefore  
he now wishes a discharge of all Claims on that head  
from your convent

Respecting your claim against  
Mr. Ford you will send me as soon as possible an  
exemplified copy of the letters Testamentary granted to  
the saidor sealed and certified in due form to make it  
evidence in a foreign state

Relative to the case of Miss  
E. Dent you will forward a letter to Mr. Wm. H. Smith  
Portobaro, as soon as possible stating when Miss Dent came  
of the age of 16 years — I have not seen Mr. G. P. Brent  
as yet concerning the purchase of Elizabeth Lancaster negro  
boy Ned, as to collecting any money I see no prospect  
untill the sales of Feb. we are all well and  
remain yrs Friend &c
