

11/ Rev. Mother, Cobb Neck January 23rd 1823

I received your last letter dated 8th Inst. wishing to know the reason of my not visiting you for some time, really its not for want of a disposition for it would give me great pleasure to visit your convent at this time or before but my removal from footstools Building repairing &c. caused me to postpone my visit until this winter but unfortunate for me about the last of november last, my horse fell with me on the road and very much injured me, so much so that I have not ventured out of the neighbourhood since, but thanks be to god I feel much better but when ever the weather is cloudy &c. I am still painfull and feel a great benefit, I do not think it will be in my power to visit you until the Spring with the Blessings of God, and his will, I'll come up, I have sold for Elizabeth Lancaster her negroes, Ned for \$400 Rose for \$200 cash which I have remitted and Bett and Children to Laurence Posey for \$550 six months Credit Harriet is yet unsold I have called on all her creditors but no money, however I have this day issued 3 warrants against her small creditors that is Baley, Bateman and Bridget. I find it is the only alternative with some people And I shall this summer if they do not pay before take legal means with

many others, I have call'd on my Sister Mary Samuels
and family with their Aunts but they have no
money but say as soon as they collect some they
will pay me whats due — I have call'd on Mr Dimont
for the note left in his father's ^{care} by Mr Wiseman he
says it is among his father's old papers but is not worth
my trouble to go and so the creditor for he is a
Begger, he is so poor. Believing Mr Dimont I have
^{never} been after him. — If there is any of my
Business that you wish a Statement of or of the
whole ^{that is concerning your Convent} be not backward in asking me for it
its my sincere wish for you to be acquainted
with every thing — do not think from this
last sentence that I have heard ^{any} thing or are displeas'd
no to the contrary

We are all well & by the prayers
of your Convent and remain yours Friend
and well wishes
