

Sister Mary Deales Neale, Cobb Neck 2^d June 1823

I Received yours dated 24th may last and observed its contents I am sorry to inform you, that I have not collected any money for you Mr Diggs and Edelen I have called on and have informd them of the purport of a former letter, ^{recd of you} they begd me to not see them that they will pay me out of their Tobo. now preparing I promise them to wait but you may depend on me if they do not comply with their promise I'll see immediately. as to the business of Miss Mattingly and Mr Clarks I am now at the fist of it. Mr Edelen has never let me know any thing of it. I have this day wrote to him on the subject — The copy of Mr Edward Mattinglys Bond is of no service to me, I should like to know if said Edward Matting is living. and Whom has the Bond, I can do nothing ^{with} either case without the proper papers — It would give me great pleasure to visit you but it is such a busy season I should have to stop a while but if I can meet with a vessel I'll come up on the first opportunity, we are all well and join in respects to you and yr Community.
