M^r. George W. AkersD^r. Sir -

Your letter to our Sister Magdalen. of the . . . instant came
 into her hands . . . days ago - & agreeing to the sale of our Negro woman - stay - to Mr.
 . N. Sawaster for \$5 - we will send her to you as soon as she can have an oppor-
 tunity - but your answer having been delayed so long - we had sold the boy & the
 girl to a gentleman in town. - ~~we supply~~ the passage of the woman to you will
 probably be to our ~~charge~~ ^{costs} & in diminution of the price of sale - but we cannot stop at
 such consideration - as our object in selling her - is not so much money - as to diminish
 the number of months - at our charge - §§ We have been surpris'd not to find
 in yr letter a mention of our letter to you of the . . . of last month - by which we
 notified to you our having rec^d your account - to which we do not entirely agree with our
 books - as to the dates & amount of particular items - for which we requested you to
 bring your receipts or Vouchers - when you come - & ~~also~~ we objected also to the 10-per
 cent Commission which you charge against us - which we are assured by friends & lawyers
 & collectors & commissioners, on all kind of accounts - is by far too much - we hope that
 you have rec^d our letter & will consider that - as we are not in a situation to make
 any great sacrifice . . . &c. &c.
