We have received on the 12th instant -
thro' the Rev^d En. Fenwick - two hundred & twenty Dollars
in Bank Notes - and a note on D. N. Caspin for \$139,25 -
the latter - as agreed - in part payment - for the bond of
M^r. C. A. G. Veale -

We thank you for this timely remittance, we
are sorry to observe - that you charge 10 per 100 - Com^{on}
upon the sale of Negro Harriet - as we considered your
Commission fixed at 5 per cent - since last year - And
we hear that much less ^{than 5 per cent} is paid here for selling
Negroes -

We have desired M^r. Roll - Digges - to pay you
with ^{as soon} ~~as little delay~~ as possible the amount of his note
accord^g - to the promise he made us last year - & you will oblige
us to remind him of it - and to forward it to us - as any other
payment - without any delay - having interest to pay
on what we owe ourselves -
