

Sister Ann Agatha Combs, 24th Jan^y 1838
I Received your last letter
a few days ago dated the 9th Inst and I assure you I
have did all in my power to collect for you, since
I Received your last I have been to Portland after
Mr J^r Parent but he has not any money. I have got
the Miss Fords Case in a good way they have
Given a draft on the United States Treasury for
\$100 and the balance in Assign notes. But
as I have put the draft in Geo. Matthews
hands to get the money for you, and I expect
by this time you have seen him as he was
to go to Geo Town in a few days after I left
him, As to Mr Combs' Case, I can do nothing
more until you send me his Note of hand
which you will send me by the first opportu-
nity, I inform you in one of my letters his answer
to mine, and you will direct me how to proceed in
his Case — You mention nothing about the
money sent by Father Pease which I expect
you have received. That is of Miss Ann Fenwick
Denns. — I see very little prospects of getting
any money for you shortly, but I hope I shall
be able to let you have some in May when I
come up on my own account we are all well
Give my love to Emily and all the Ladies of my
