MISSION STATEMENT

Georgetown Visitation, founded in 1799, is a college preparatory school rooted in the Roman Catholic faith and Salesian tradition, committed to educating young women from diverse backgrounds. We are a faith-centered community dedicated to educational excellence and enriched by co-curricular and service programs. Our mission is to empower our students to meet the demands and challenges of today's rapidly changing and morally complex world. We guide our students to become self-reliant, intellectually mature, and morally responsible women of faith, vision, and purpose.

STUDENT BODY

Georgetown Visitation enrolls 499 young women in grades 9-12 who live in the District of Columbia (80 students), suburban Maryland (213 students) and Virginia (206 students). Approximately 29% of the student body receives financial aid; currently the school awards around \$2 million in aid annually. There are 120 students in the Class of 2018.

ACADEMIC PROGRAM

The academic program focuses on a strong foundation in English, mathematics, science, history, religion, and foreign language. *Beginning with the 2017-2018 academic year, Visitation moved to a trimester model.* Students have access to a range of electives, including Advanced Placement and honors courses, advanced study through the Bridge Program with Georgetown University, and courses offered through the Online School for Girls. The caliber of the colleges and universities Georgetown Visitation graduates attend is a testament to how well prepared our students are.

RANK

Due to the strength and rigor of our curriculum, we do not assign class rank. A cumulative grade point average is computed at the end of each year and is derived from final grades of coursework taken only at Georgetown Visitation. All subjects except Chorus, Orchestra, P.E., and summer school courses are included in the GPA. Honors and AP courses are weighted with an additional .7 in the calculation of the grade point average. Calculus is weighted with an additional .35. Letter grades are unweighted.

Students at Georgetown Visitation Preparatory School are governed by an Honor Code that encourages an atmosphere of mutual respect and trust in our community. As young women bound by a code of conduct, all students are expected to answer all college application questions truthfully.
